across the globe. The first LEO club was started in 1957 in Pennsylvania and there are now more than 5,700 LEO clubs in 140 countries.

The Indian River LEO Club was established by the Fenwick Island Lions Club. The Club functions and is governed loosely by a Constitution and by-laws prescribed by Lions Clubs International. Lions Club members Jim and Carolyn Miles serve as liaisons with the LEO Club and the LEO Club advisor is math teacher Ms. Laura Quillen, who is ably assisted by fellow math teacher, Ms. Amy Hughes.
